AKRON, OHIO (July 22, 2016) – The Susan G. Komen Northeast Ohio Akron Race for the Cure[®] takes place on July 23, 2016. The Race for the Cure includes a brand new 5K Race/Walk route through Downtown Akron and a 1-Mile Fun Walk. Canal Park Stadium is the new home to the Akron Race for the Cure and provides a great starting point for a scenic Race course. Komen Northeast Ohio brings together members of its 22 county service area on Race day with a single goal: to make an impact in the fight against breast cancer.

The Northeast Ohio Race for the Cure Series is Komen Northeast Ohio's primary local fundraiser. Komen Northeast Ohio hopes to raise \$170,000 through the Akron Race and the fundraising efforts of individuals. Race teams are rewarded as they make an impact on breast cancer. The top 10 Race for the Cure fundraisers are recognized by The Pink Honor Roll and will receive a gift package, an Honor Roll T-shirt, recognition on Komen's website, plus a special Race bib for the following year's Race.

With activities like the inspiring Survivor Ceremony, Kids' Dash, the 5K Race/Walk, and a 1-Mile Walk, the Race for the Cure is sure to please everyone in the family. The Susan G. Komen Race for the Cure Series is the world's largest and most successful fundraising and education event for breast cancer ever created. Your participation in this event helps Komen Northeast Ohio provide significant funds and bring awareness about breast cancer to our local community. Susan G. Komen is the global leader of the breast cancer movement, having invested nearly \$1.95 billion in research and support programs since its inception in 1982. Locally, Komen Northeast Ohio has invested over \$15 million dollars into the community since 1994. Up to 75 percent of the funds raised through the Race for the Cure stay in the community for educational programs, free mammograms and diagnostic services, and survivor support programs. The remaining 25 percent helps fund the Susan G. Komen National Research and Awards Program.

We race to fight together because no one stands alone. In 1980, the 5-year relative survival rate for women diagnosed with early stage breast cancer (cancer confined to the breast) was about 74 percent. Today, that number is 99 percent! Komen has played a critical role in every major advance in the fight against breast cancer - transforming how the world talks about and treats this disease and helping to turn millions of breast cancer patients into breast cancer survivors. This progress was made with the

community's continued support and participation in the Race for the Cure Series. Together, we can reach our vision of a world without breast cancer.

Vision: to create a world without breast cancer

- Susan G. Komen Northeast Ohio® serves a 22- county region of Northeast Ohio and is one of 102 Affiliates around the globe responsible for leading the global movement to end breast cancer forever.
- The Northeast Ohio Affiliate serves 22 counties that include: Ashland, Ashtabula, Belmont, Carroll, Columbiana, Coshocton, Cuyahoga, Geauga, Harrison, Holmes, Jefferson, Lake, Lorain, Mahoning, Medina, Portage, Richland, Stark, Summit, Trumbull, Tuscarawas, and Wayne.
- Komen Northeast Ohio is the primary breast health resource that empowers people to take charge of their own health. Our promise is to save lives and end breast cancer forever by empowering people, ensuring quality care for all, and energizing science to find the cures. Up to 75% of the net proceeds generated by Komen Northeast Ohio each year stays in Northeast Ohio through our community grants program. These grants are given to local organizations that provide free or low-cost breast health education, outreach, screening, and survivor support programs. The remaining 25% goes to the Susan G. Komen National Research Grant Program to fund breast cancer research.
- Every two years, the Komen Northeast Ohio Affiliate assesses breast health education, screening, and treatment services in all 22 counties to identify specific unmet breast health needs. Conducted at the local level, the Northeast Ohio Community Needs Profile is used to direct the Affiliate's grant making decisions to ensure that programs funded will fill gaps without duplicating existing services. This process is unique to Komen.
- In 2016, Komen Northeast Ohio granted nearly \$350,000 to five organizations in our local community. More than 6,500 Northeast Ohio individuals with little or no insurance will receive important breast health information, a free mammogram, or support services. In addition, thousands will benefit from breast health education programs provided by Komen Northeast Ohio, such as our annual survivors' symposium and through our speakers group, the Komen Community Representatives.

- Since 1994, Komen Northeast Ohio has provided over \$15 million in community grants to Northeast Ohio agencies working to end breast cancer. As excellent financial stewards, general administrative and overhead expenses, excluding fundraising expenses, are held to less than 15%.
- The Komen Northeast Ohio Race for the Cure® is the Affiliate's primary fundraiser. Held each year in the summer/fall, over 10,000 participants including 2,000 breast cancer survivors come together to raise funds and awareness while demonstrating support for those battling breast cancer. More than 60 Northeast Ohio Corporations support the Race through corporate sponsorships.
- The Komen Northeast Ohio Affiliate is a volunteer driven organization. With only five full-time staff, the Affiliate relies on over 500 volunteers each year to carry out its fundraising and mission initiatives.
