

Ohio's Breast and Cervical Cancer Project (BCCP) is a program that provides high quality breast and cervical cancer screening, diagnostic testing, and case management services at no cost to [eligible](#) women in Ohio. Women eligible for breast cancer screenings must be between the ages of 50-64 with no insurance and incomes at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level.

The BCCP not only provides funds for cancer screenings, they also provide health education, provider trainings, and patient navigation services.

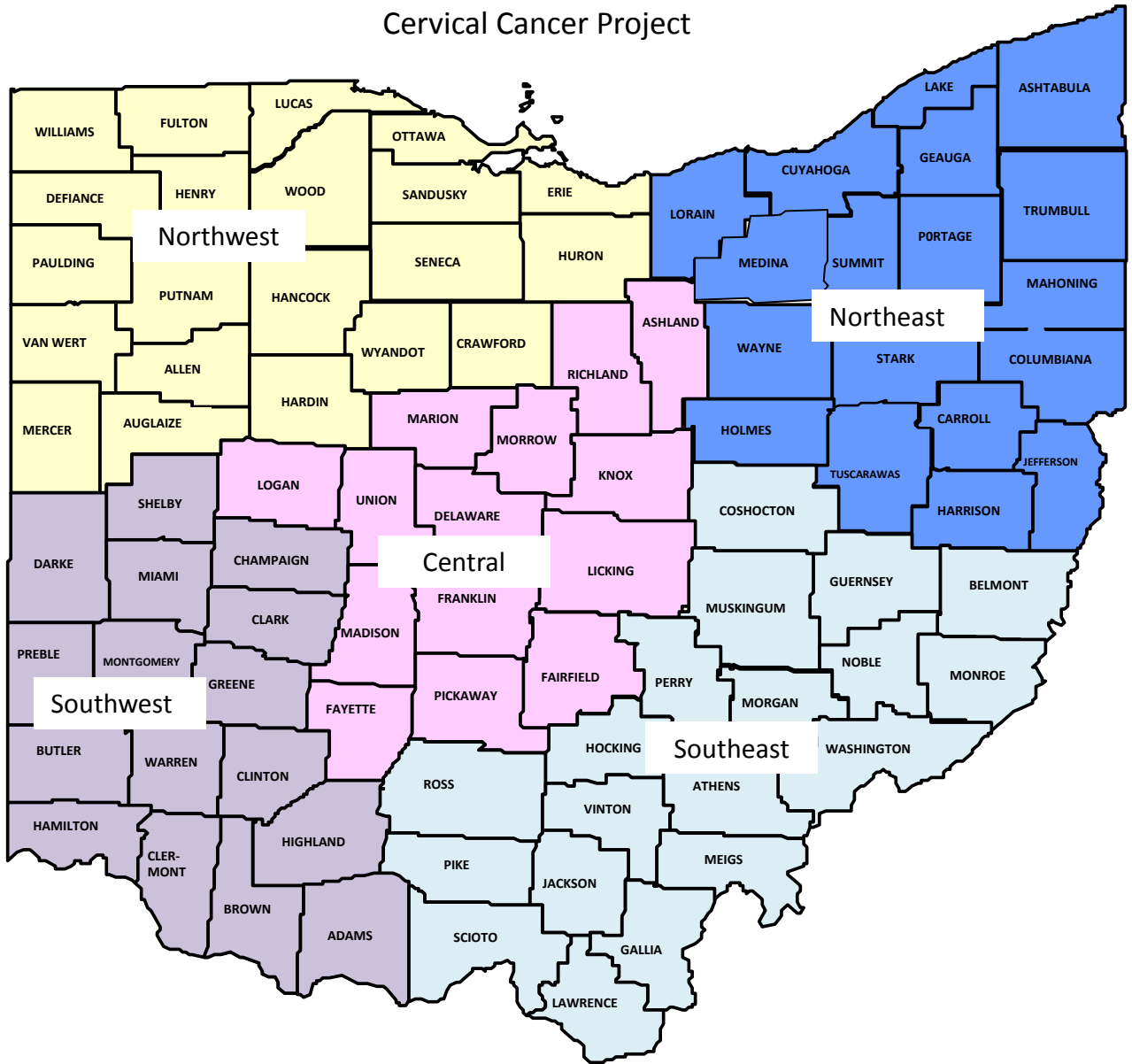
Any organization that applies to Susan G. Komen Northeast Ohio® for grant funding must refer eligible women to Ohio's BCCP as the first point of contact prior to using Komen funds for screenings and/or diagnostics (please see page 6 of the [Request for Applications](#) for more information). Additionally, any organization that plans to administer breast cancer screenings and/or diagnostics must have a provider agreement on record with the BCCP Regional Enrollment Agency (REA) and a Letter of Support that reflects that an agreement is on file.

In 2016, Ohio's BCCP underwent some major programmatic changes that impact the way BCCP services are delivered. Below is a summary of the major changes Komen Northeast Ohio grantees should be aware of.

- BCCP REA's have decreased from eleven regions to five (please see the back of this document for specifics). Additionally, five year provider agreements were up for renewal in 2016. Due to these facts, some organizations/health systems may have to re-sign their provider agreements, potentially with a different REA. **Please ensure your organization/health system has an active, signed provider agreement with the REA serving your patients prior to submitting a grant to Komen Northeast Ohio.**
- BCCP case managers now enroll eligible women into expanded Medicaid; they also assist former BCCP beneficiaries who are now privately insured with using their health insurance for breast health services.
- BCCP REA's are now required to conduct population-based strategies to decrease health disparities, including hosting mobile screening clinics and community outreach.
- BCCP REA's are now required to host provider trainings.
- BCCP REA's now have funds dedicated to marketing and promotion of the program. Please contact your REA to get printed materials sent to your organization/health system. Komen Northeast Ohio strongly recommends you have BCCP information available for all breast health patients.
